NOTES

The Betting Act, 1931 requires that, not less than a fortnight or more than a month before applying to the Minister, the applicant must publish notice of intention to make the application at least once in a daily newspaper published and circulated in Dublin. This form should be accompanied by a copy of the newspaper notice. All applicants are now required to send in a Bank statement or letter from a Bank as confirmation of their financial standing. Provision of this information will facilitate the speedy renewal of this application. In addition, an applicant who is ordinarily resident outside the State, is required to forward a copy of his/her current Bookmakers licence issued in his/her country of residence.
